# THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE ELECTION DAY TO PROTECT YOUR **VOTE**

- 1 VERIFY** your Registration Status **BEFORE** Election Day - Make sure you are listed on the registration roll by calling your local Board of Elections.
- 2 VERIFY** your polling location before **ELECTION** Day. Call 1-866-OUR-VOTE. (1-866-687-8683)
- 3 VERIFY** that **YOU** will be in town on Election Day - If you're scheduled to be out of town, are homebound, in the military, in a nursing home, or working and unable to get off on Election Day you can vote by absentee ballot.
- 4 BRING YOUR I.D.** Don't Leave Home Without It! You may need to show I.D. to vote. To be safe, bring your voter registration card, driver's license, government issued photo ID, a paycheck, utility bill or government document that includes your name and street address.
- 5 YOU HAVE A RIGHT** to request help from poll workers. Poll workers are there to help **YOU**.
- 6 YOU HAVE A RIGHT** to file a complaint if your rights have been violated. If you need legal assistance all 1-866-OUR-VOTE. (1-866-687-8683)
- 7 YOU HAVE A RIGHT** to cast a provisional ballot if you are certain you are a registered voter. Please verify that you are at the right polling place before you use a provisional ballot to ensure your provisional ballot is counted!
